Lucas Builders worked tirelessly over the holidays to remodel the southern end of the library into a student foyer with a new external entrance, two small offices to serve the Heads of Primary and Secondary, and a computer work-room. The library is now operating in a reduced space but the effect is quite cosy and looks great. The biggest advantage to students of this upgrade is the additional verandah

space. This will be a great area for providing protection from the summer sun and from inclement weather (should we be so lucky).
