PROPAGANDA POSTERS-A VIEW OF HISTORY

During Year 11 History last term we learnt about the fall of Germany after World War One and the rise of the Adolf Hitler and his Nazi party.

We were asked to design a poster about Hitler's book, *Mein Kampf*, a phrase which means "my struggle". This represented Hitler's point of view of the world and his plans for change.

For those who don't know, Hitler was a very powerful dictator who could convince a country to think like him. He was also against many people such as the Jews and people with disabilities. He

tried to create what he thought was 'the perfect race', and as a result he killed over 6 million people during his time in power.

My poster pictured here was designed to advertise and sell Hitler's story, *Mein Kampf*, to the German population during 1933. We had to think creatively and use lots of propaganda in these posters.
