## EXPLORING OUR SHIRE

Moira Shire recently sponsored a tour of Cobram township for the local members of Junior Council. The aim of the tour was to educate students about the varied activities and services in our town including the great job opportunities available through the shire. The tour was also a means of educating students about the way in which new projects and plans have to go through many drafting processes.

For example, we saw the first draft of the future Showgrounds and Apex Reserve, something which even Council has not yet seen. These projects could take 10 more years before they come to fruition.

Many people described their careers in the Shire and the different career pathways available. We heard from a Recreation Officer, a Youth Development Officer and a Sustainability Officer. These people described their jobs and encouraged Junior Councillors to consider taking up employment opportunities within the Shire.

The tour moved on to the future town square. This is the epicentre of the town, the place where a new traffic island will be made, where traffic flow will be improved and pedestrians better catered for.

Following this, everyone gathered at Oasis Retirement Village to hear Libra Mustica's story. The theme of his story was that perseverance pays off: finally a Minister of Government over-ruled the local authorities and Libra will go ahead with his plans for expanding the Village.

Next on the agenda was the landfill or dump, where we met all the other schools. This was a smelly but interesting area because of the state of the art facilities which Cobram landfill has. We have a very environmentally-friendly tip!

We had lunch at the Civic centre with councillors from the whole Shire, then made our final visit — to Cobram Foodbank.

It was intriguing to explore different aspects of Cobram which we haven't seen before and we thank Moira Council for providing this opportunity.
